From Fr. Kirby:

As we begin the Sacred Triduum this coming Thursday, we arrive in a strange time dealing with the Coronavirus. There is a lot of unknowns and valid concerns. As the disciples gathered around Jesus at that first Holy Thursday I am sure they were dealing with a lot of unknowns and had a lot of questions. "What is going to happen to us?" "What should we do?"

Jesus reassures his disciples, and us, his disciples of today, that he will always be with us! He gives us three holy reminders of his loving presence: his Eucharistic presence, ministerial priesthood and his call for charity. The Eucharist is the heart of Christ, who feeds us constantly with his loving presence. We need to consume him a lot! The priest is ordained to give his life for others, so that all may receive our Lord's Sacramental presence. As we follow the command of the Lord to "wash other people's feet" we experience the love of God in action. We call this charity! Yes, on Holy Thursday, Jesus reminds us that he is with us!

The Good Friday liturgy is very good because it shows us that Jesus is victor over the cross! Far from a funeral, the liturgy points out that our Lord's sacrificial love can never be stopped! Even though we deal with this Coronavirus today we will be victorious through our Lord's glorious cross. The ancient antiphon of the Church becomes clear. "We adore you O Christ, and we praise you because, by your holy cross, you have redeemed the world."

Holy Saturday & Easter Sunday proclaim the central message of Christ that he has risen from the dead and has won for us eternal life. Jesus has the last word of our life!

Jesus Christ's victory over the cross, the tomb, and yes my friends, over this virus is supreme. His victory of Easter Sunday is our ultimate cure! (continued on back)
