From Fr. Kirby

My Dear people we begin the holy season of Advent, a time of preparation for the coming of Christ in our life. The word "Advent" means coming, so during this graced time we focus on the Comings of Christ.

It was St. Bernard of Clairvaux who wrote about the three-fold coming of Christ in the season of Advent. This Cistercian saint would joyfully proclaim that Christ comes to us in HISTORY, MYSTERY AND MAJESTY.

We first ready ourselves to prepare for Christ's coming in HISTORY over 2000 years ago on the solemnity of Christmas. That God loved the world so much that he sent his only Son in the flesh to save us and redeem us.

St. Bernard also reminds us that Christ will come again at the end of time. We call this Christ coming to us in MAJESTY. The gospel is quick to remind us that we do not know the day the hour, but the kingdom of God will be fulfilled.

Finally, our Advent Saint tells us that that Christ comes to us in MYSTERY every moment of our life. It is up to us to be attentive so that we can encounter Christ's loving presence.

Yes, Christ comes to us in the holy season of Advent in HIS-TORY, MYSTERY AND MAJESTY. It is my prayer that you have a holy Advent, so that you can have a holy Christmas. A great way to prepare for the great solemnity of Christmas is to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please consider taking advantage of the numerous extended times that this Sacrament will be offered through out the season of Advent.
